

## HEALTH

### **Leviticus 26:14-16 (NKJV)**

<sup>14</sup> 'But if you do not obey Me, and do not observe all these commandments. <sup>15</sup> and if you despise My statutes, or if your soul abhors My judgments, so that you do not perform all My commandments, but break My covenant, <sup>16</sup> I also will do this to you: I will even appoint terror over you, wasting disease and fever which shall consume the eyes and cause sorrow of heart. And you shall sow your seed in vain, for your enemies shall eat it.

### **Deuteronomy 34:7 (KJV)**

<sup>7</sup> And Moses was an hundred and twenty years old when he died: his eye was not dim, nor his natural force abated.

### **Job 2:3-6 (AMP)**

<sup>3</sup> And the Lord said to Satan, Have you considered My servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, on who [reverently] fears God and abstains from and shuns all evil [because it is wrong]?. And still he holds fast his integrity, although you moved Me against him to destroy him without cause. <sup>4</sup> Then Satan answered the Lord, Skin for skin! Yes, all that a man has will he give for his life. <sup>5</sup> But put forth Your hand now, and touch his bone and his flesh, and he will curse and renounce You to Your face. <sup>6</sup> And the Lord said to Satan, Behold, he is in your hand; only spare his life.

### **Job 13:4 (KJV)**

<sup>4</sup> But ye are forgers of lies, ye are all physicians of no value.

### **Job 21:7 (NIV)**

<sup>7</sup> Why do the wicked live on, growing old and increasing in power?

### **Job 33:25 (CEV)**

<sup>25</sup> Our health is restored, we feel young again.

### **Psalms 21:4 (KJV)**

<sup>4</sup> He asked life of thee, and thou gavest it him, even length of days for ever and ever.

### **Psalms 73:4 (CEV)**

<sup>4</sup> They never have to suffer, they stay healthy.

### **Psalms 128:3 (KJV)**

<sup>3</sup> Thy wife shall be as a fruitful vine by the sides of thine house: thy children like olive plants round about thy table.

### **Proverbs 15:30 (CEV)**

<sup>30</sup> A friendly smile makes you happy, and good news makes you feel strong.

### **Ecclesiastes 7:17 (NKJV)**

<sup>17</sup> Do not be overly wicked, nor be foolish: Why should you die before your time?

### **Isaiah 33:24 (NIV)**

<sup>24</sup> No one living in Zion will say, "I am ill" and the sins of those who dwell there will be forgiven.

### **Isaiah 38:1-6 (KJV)**

<sup>1</sup> In those days was Hezekiah sick unto death. And Isaiah the prophet the son of Amoz came unto him, and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Set thine house in order: for thou shalt die, and not live. <sup>2</sup> Then Hezekiah turned his face toward the wall, and prayed unto the LORD, <sup>3</sup> And said, Remember now, O LORD, I beseech thee, how I have walked before thee in truth and with a perfect heart, and have done that which is good in thy sight. And Hezekiah wept sore. <sup>4</sup> Then came the word of the LORD to Isaiah, saying, <sup>5</sup> Go, and say to Hezekiah, Thus saith the LORD, the God of David thy father, I have heard thy prayer, and I have seen thy tears: behold, I will add unto thy days fifteen years. <sup>6</sup> And I will deliver thee and this city out of the hand of the king of Assyria: and I will defend this city.

### **Isaiah 38:16 (CEV)**

<sup>16</sup> Your words and your deeds bring life to everyone, including me. Please make me healthy and strong again.

### **Lamentations 3:17 (CEV)**

<sup>17</sup> I cannot find peace or remember happiness.

### Daniel 1:3-20 (NKJV)

<sup>3</sup> Then the king instructed Ashpenaz, the master of his eunuchs, to bring some of the children of Israel and some of the king's descendants and some of the nobles, <sup>4</sup> young men in whom *there was* no blemish, but good-looking, gifted in all wisdom, possessing knowledge and quick to understand, who *had* ability to serve in the king's palace, and whom they might teach the language and literature of the Chaldeans. <sup>5</sup> And the king appointed for them a daily provision of the king's delicacies and of the wine which he drank, and three years of training for them, so that at the end of *that time* they might serve before the king. <sup>6</sup> Now from among those of the sons of Judah were Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. <sup>7</sup> To them the chief of the eunuchs gave names: he gave Daniel *the name* Belteshazzar; to Hananiah, Shadrach; to Mishael, Meshach; and to Azariah, Abed-Nego. <sup>8</sup> But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself. <sup>9</sup> Now God had brought Daniel into the favor and goodwill of the chief of the eunuchs. <sup>10</sup> And the chief of the eunuchs said to Daniel, "I fear my lord the king, who has appointed your food and drink. For why should he see your faces looking worse than the young men who *are* your age? Then you would endanger my head before the king." <sup>11</sup> So Daniel said to the steward whom the chief of the eunuchs had set over Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, <sup>12</sup> "Please test your servants for ten days, and let them give us vegetables to eat and water to drink. <sup>13</sup> Then let our appearance be examined before you, and the appearance of the young men who eat the portion of the king's delicacies; and as you see fit, *so* deal with your servants." <sup>14</sup> So he consented with them in this matter, and tested them ten days. <sup>15</sup> And at the end of ten days their features appeared better and fatter in flesh than all the young men who ate the portion of the king's delicacies. <sup>16</sup> Thus the steward took away their portion of delicacies and the wine that they were to drink, and gave them vegetables. <sup>17</sup> As for these four young men, God gave them knowledge and skill in all literature and wisdom; and Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams. <sup>18</sup> Now at the end of the days, when the king had said that they should be brought in, the chief of the eunuchs brought them in before Nebuchadnezzar. <sup>19</sup> Then the king interviewed them, and among them all none was found like Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah; therefore they served before the king. <sup>20</sup> And in all matters of wisdom *and* understanding about which the king examined them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians *and* astrologers who *were* in all his realm.

### Mark 5:25-26 (KJV)

<sup>25</sup> And a certain woman, which had an issue of blood twelve years, <sup>26</sup> and had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse.

### **Mark 9:43-48 (MPV)**

<sup>43</sup> And if your hand puts a stumbling block before you and causes you to sin, cut it off ! It is more profitable and wholesome for you to go into life [that is really worthwhile] maimed than with two hand to go to hell (Gehenna), into the fire that cannot be put out. <sup>45</sup> And if your foot is a cause of stumbling and sin to you, cut it off ! It is more profitable and wholesome for you to enter into life [that is really worthwhile] crippled than, than having two feet, to be cast into hell (Gehenna). <sup>47</sup> And if your eye causes you to stumble and sin, pluck it out ! It is more profitable and wholesome for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into hell (Gehenna), <sup>48</sup> Where their worm [which preys on the inhabitants and is a symbol of the wound inflicted on the man himself by his sins] does not die, and the fire is not put out.

### **John 5:14 (NKJV)**

<sup>14</sup> Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you."

### **John 9:1-12 (NIV)**

<sup>1</sup> As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. <sup>2</sup> His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" <sup>3</sup> Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the work of God might be displayed in his life. <sup>4</sup> As long as it is day, we must do the work of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. <sup>5</sup> While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." <sup>6</sup> Having said this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man's eyes. "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam" (this word means Sent). So the man went and washed, and came home seeing. <sup>8</sup> His neighbors and those who had formerly seen him begging asked, "Isn't this the same man who used to sit and beg?" <sup>9</sup> Some claimed that he was. Other said, "No, he only looks like him." But he himself insisted, "I am the man." <sup>10</sup> "How then were your eyes opened?" they demanded. <sup>11</sup> He replied, "The man they call Jesus made some mud and put it on my eyes. He told me to go to Siloam and wash. So I went and washed, and then I could see." <sup>12</sup> "Where is this man?" they asked him. "I don't know," he said.

### **1 Timothy 4:8-9 (NKJV)**

<sup>8</sup> For bodily exercise profits a little, but godliness is profitable for all things, having promise of the life that now is and of that which is to come. <sup>9</sup> This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance.

### **3 John 2 (AMP)**

<sup>2</sup> Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in every way and [that your body] may keep well, even as [I know] your soul keeps well and prospers.
